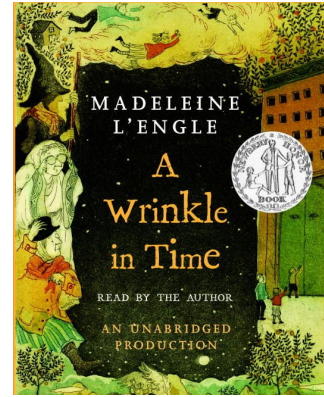


## GALA Summer Reading - 8th Grade

In Eight grade, students will discuss the novel by Madeleine L'Engle - **A Wrinkle in Time** To prepare for this work we are recommending that each student read the novel over the summer.

A tesseract (in case the reader doesn't know) is a wrinkle in time. To tell more would rob the reader of the enjoyment of Miss L'Engle's unusual book. *A Wrinkle in Time*, winner of the Newbery Medal in 1963, is the story of the adventures in space and time of Meg, Charles Wallace, and Calvin O'Keefe (athlete, student, and one of the most popular boys in high school). They are in search of Meg's father, a scientist who disappeared while engaged in secret work for the government on the tesseract problem.



### **Assignment: Double-Entry Journal Due: First Week of English classes**

Divide your paper into two columns

Left Side - Record specific “passages” from the book. Use quotation marks and include page numbers

Right Side - Explain your comments, thoughts, reactions and ideas about the passage.

A minimum of 10 journal entries are required

Set up your paper to look like this example
