DESCRIPTION OF SCHOOL:

Girls Academic Leadership Academy (GALA): Dr. Michelle King School for STEM is the first and only **PUBLIC all-girls STEM school** in LAUSD and California. GALA serves girls in grades 6-12. Established in 2016, GALA is a leader in student achievement; girls have the opportunity to excel in academics with a focus on STEM, leadership, and social-emotional skills. Our pillars are excellence, leadership, wellness, and honor. GALA is a Title 1 school and we welcome girls who are committed to a rigorous college-prep curriculum. GALA has achieved a **100% graduation rate and, last year, a 100% college acceptance rate.**

ADMISSIONS:

GALA is an LAUSD public school. GALA is not a charter and not a magnet school. New student applications are through the LAUSD Choices application website from October 1-November 14.

ACADEMIC SCHEDULE

GALA features an Advisory and seven periods. Mondays, all classes meet. Tuesday-Friday, we follow an alternating block schedule (90 minutes each). A-days are Tues./Thurs. (Advisory, periods 1, 3, 5) and B-days are Wed./Fri. (Advisory, periods 2, 4, 6). The 7th period is a required elective, meeting four times a week.

School Hours: Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday - 8:30am-3:33pm and Tuesdays 8:30am-2:33pm

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

In 2016, LAUSD aligned their graduation requirements with the A-G University of California minimum subject requirements. GALA requires girls to complete STEM courses above these so our students are best prepared for the rigor of college courses. GALA requires 2 years of Computer Science in high school, a graduation requirement unique to any other LAUSD school.

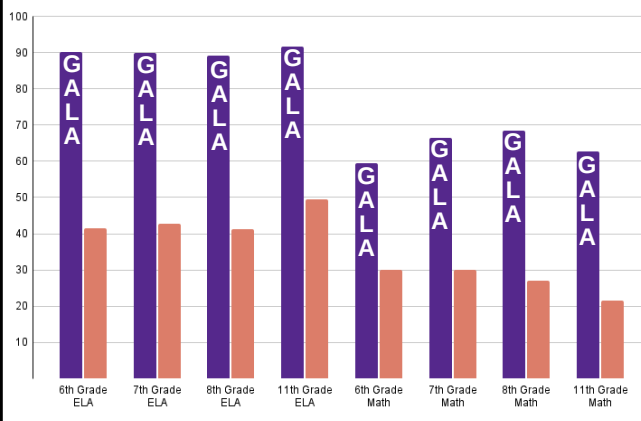

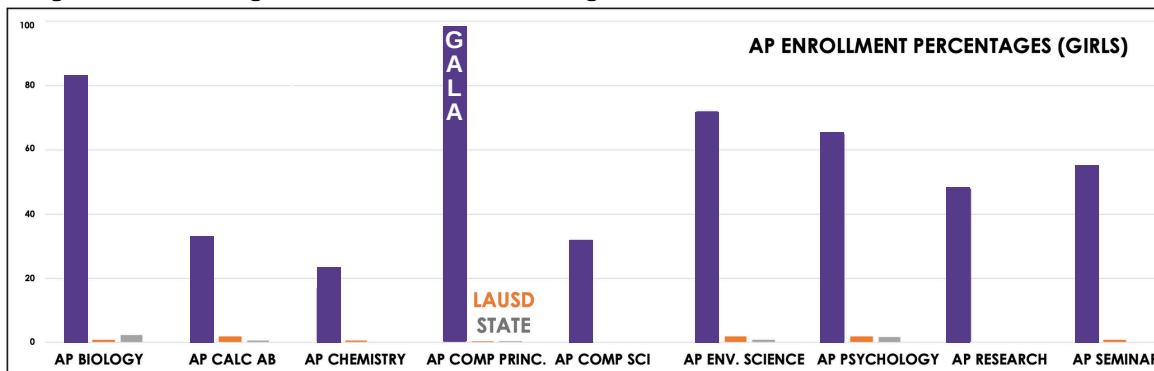

ADVANCED PLACEMENT - GALA is changing educational gender norms of girls taking AP STEM classes. AP Computer Principals is required. GALA does not have grade pre-requisites for AP classes. Any student can take AP classes and the AP test if they are willing to do the academic rigor. 100% AP enrollment. All AP testing is free to GALA students.



STUDENT PSAT AND SAT TESTING

- PSAT: Tests administered free on the GALA campus for 8th - 11th grades for no fee.
- SAT: 11th Grade SAT tests administered on the GALA campus for no fee.

GRADING & COURSES

GRADE AND GPA SCALE

GALA uses a 4-point scale to calculate grade point averages. LAUSD augments weighted GPA by adding 0.05 for each AP/Honors/ select college courses per semester.
A = 4.0 B = 3.0 C = 2.0 D = 1.0

EQUITY GRADING & INSTRUCTION

Equity, standards-based grading is a growth-mindset approach to teaching and learning, based on the expectation that everyone can learn when provided the right conditions and support. Students are evaluated on a 4-point rubric provided per standard in each academic class.

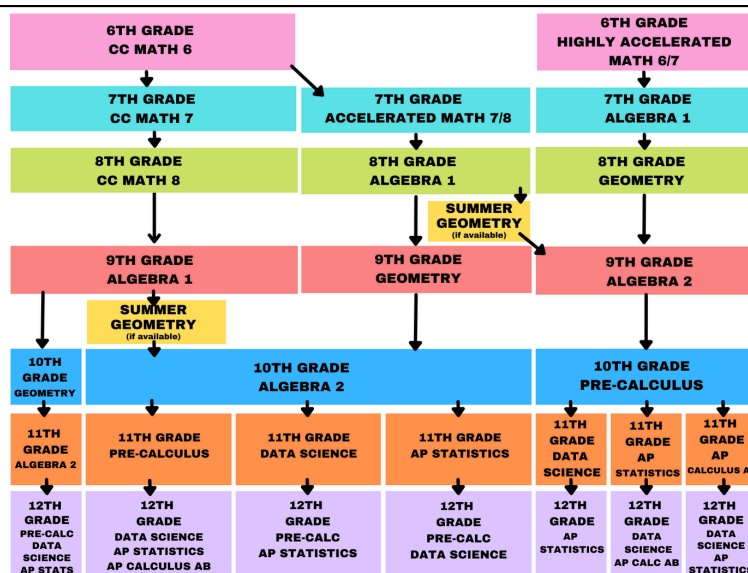
GALA MATH FLOW CHART

Starting in the 2025-2026 school year, students can accelerate in math beginning in 6th grade. 6th-grade acceleration is based on an assessment test. 7th-grade acceleration is based on the student's willingness to accept academic rigor and the teacher's recommendation.
